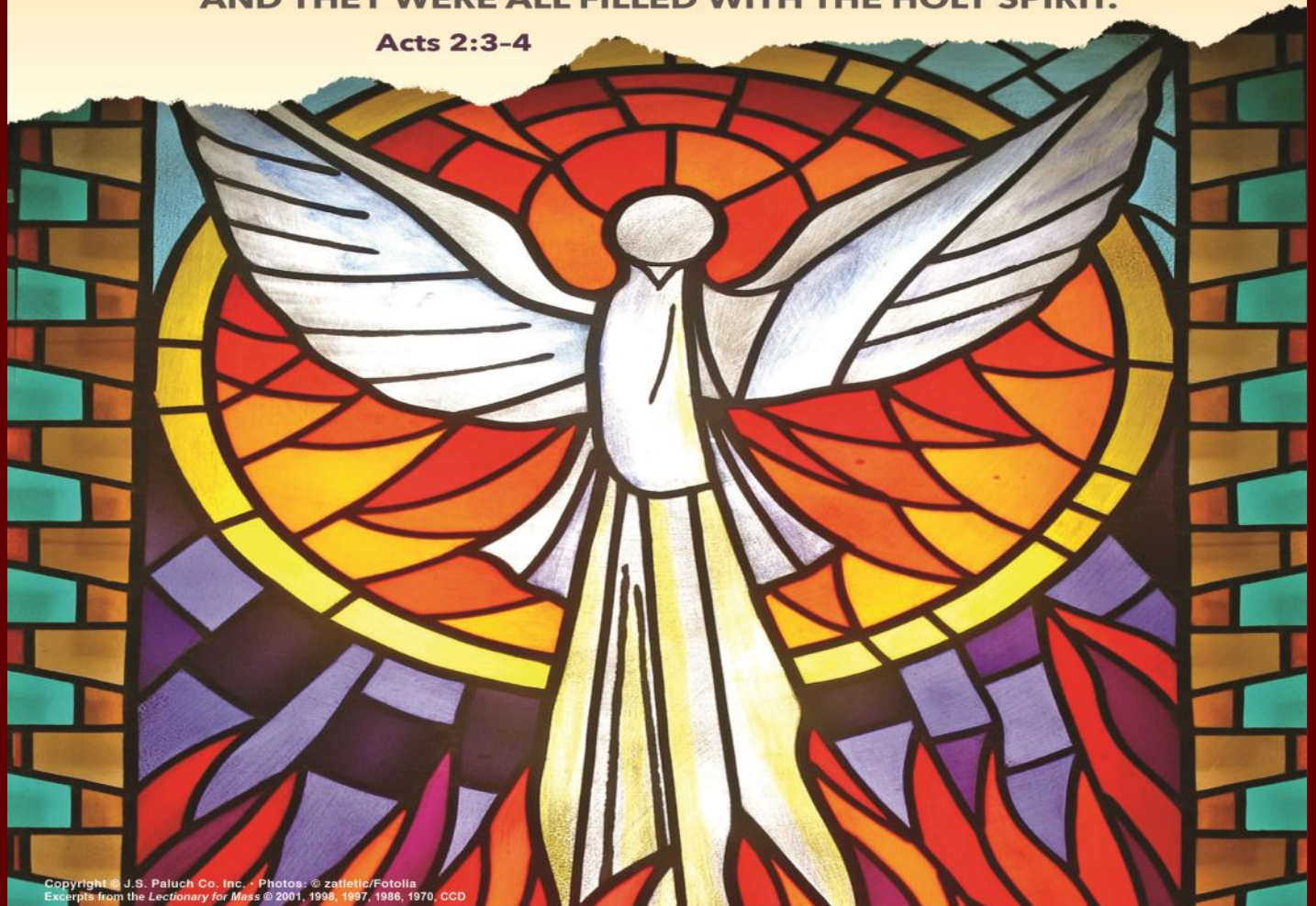

### **BAPTISM**

### **CONFIRMATION**

Adult Confirmation is hosted annually. For those under 18, Confirmation typically occurs in the fall of their junior year of high school. Preparation is required, including PSR, for teens not enrolled in a Catholic school. Please contact the Pastoral Services Center for more detailed information.

**Baptism & Confirmation** sponsors must be Confirmed, practicing Catholics and will need to provide a letter of good standing from the parish in which they are registered.

### **MARRIAGE**

Engaged couples should contact the priest at least six months prior to their anticipated wedding date.

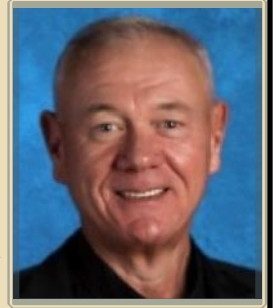

## Our Challenge



Dear friends,

The miracle of Pentecost was the coming of the Holy Spirit as the vital force of the Church's life, so much so that we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost each year as the 'birthday' of our Church. At the first Pentecost, the Spirit's presence and power were invisible but there were plenty of visible signs that something miraculous had happened to the followers of Jesus. St. Paul warns us that there is no 'single' sign of the Holy Spirit's presence and power. The Spirit's gifts vary from individual to individual. We all have different talents and duties. But whatever our calling or our abilities, we make the Spirit manifest in our daily lives. Jesus bestowed the gift of the Holy Spirit on his disciples following his resurrection, and it empowered them to preach the gospel to all nations. This same Spirit was later poured out on them at Pentecost. From that moment forward all Christians share in the gift of the Holy Spirit. We have greatly refined our methods of research and our standards of proof. But both of these ways of discovering and establishing truth are based on common sense notions of evidence. We explain hidden causes in terms of their manifest effects. We detect God through the visible signs of God's invisible presence in our lives. We are taught that the Spirit of God bears witness to our spirits, teaching us to pray, helping us to live, keeping us through death. The stubborn cynic asks for signs of God's existence. Those signs are everywhere available for the asking, but they are not the kind of miraculous demonstrations the unbeliever demands. God is revealed in the human hand and human face. Those who lend a hand or speak a word in love are the visible signs of God's invisible presence

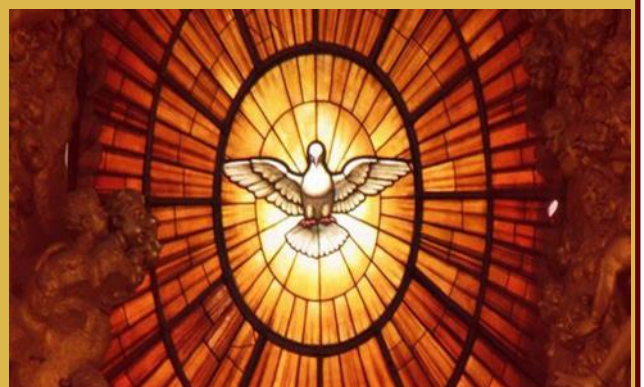

## Important Message from our Pastor May 18, 2020

Dear friends,

Please see the important instructions ([written](#) or [video](#)) at the homepage of our website [www.aloysius.org](http://www.aloysius.org) about returning to Masses in Phase 1. Please take a moment to take the very [brief survey](#), also in the same location, about your plans to return to Masses at St. Aloysius. This is important! The results will help me determine if a reservation and ticketing process will be implemented to attend any of our Masses. I don't want anyone to arrive and be locked out because we reach our maximum 25% occupancy. In order to assure that every registered household of our parish receives this information, it has been mailed via USPS to every household.

While our regularly scheduled weekday Masses resumed Monday morning May 18, our regularly scheduled weekend Masses will resume Saturday, May 23, 2020, with our Vigil Mass for the Feast of the Ascension. Note that all our Masses are now being conducted in compliance with the strict Phase 1 instructions of our bishop to make the experience as safe as possible for all, but getting out for Mass cannot be entirely risk-free. This is the reason that all Catholics continue to be dispensed until further notice from their obligation to attend a Sunday Mass, and I'm encouraging our households to select a weekday Mass to attend weekly to receive Holy Communion. I continue to urge anyone at high risk owing to age, any illness, or health conditions, as well as those caring for someone at high risk, or families with infants and small children, to consider staying home. Getting out increases the risk of exposure to the virus.

We're unable to supply face coverings or masks at this time. Please remember to bring and wear your own.

'On hold' for the moment is rescheduling of RCIA rites, adult confirmations, first communions, and baptisms at Masses. We haven't yet figured out how to accommodate these with our current capacity and other restrictions of Phase 1. We also do not yet have the 'OK' to resume scheduling new events, meetings, or activities in our facilities.

Your parish Pastoral Council continues to meet with me virtually every Monday evening to assess the status of our parish and how we are keeping our parishioners connected and informed. They are able to help me communicate my needs and 'getting the word out' about the ways you can help. These ladies and gentlemen are amazing in their dedication and love for our Church parish, as I know all of us are!

I'm indebted to many of you for all your messages and gestures of concern, support, and encouragement. Many of us have been frequently at 'wits end' with the challenges we're all encountering for the first time in our lives, and the stress from it is overwhelming. I know. I understand. I'm going through the same thing with you. In our collective 'powerlessness' over so many things, it is only with the strength and courage that comes from God alone that we trudge forward every day, striving to remain positive and constructive in all our thoughts, words, and actions, doing the best we can through 'trial and error' on a daily basis.

While our 'private' Masses have now ceased, we want to continue providing a recorded Sunday Mass to our parishioners who are unable to attend Mass or want to stay safe and watch Mass at home. I am enlisting the help of volunteers who will attend the Saturday Vigil Mass and bring their camera and tripod to record it to be posted to our website and Facebook page on Saturday night so it is available to you to watch anytime you want on Sundays. I am hoping we'll get enough volunteers to do it on a rotating basis for the duration of Phase 1. Once again, I thank you for your patience and prayers, as we navigate new realities to ensure everyone's safety and protection.

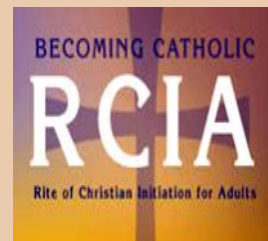

**Reopening of St. Aloysius Church!**  
**Instructions for Mass Attendance: [WATCH](#)**

**IMPORTANT NOTES:** During this Phase 1 time.....

- (1) We are unable to permit any seating in our Cry Room during Masses.
- (2) We are unable to provide Nursery Services or Children's Church during any Masses.
- (3) We are unable to offer 'Coffee & Donuts' after 9AM Sunday Mass.

**INSIDE THE CHURCH.**

You won't be able to sit where you usually sit. This is important! To ensure compliance with social distancing requirements, many pews are 'taped off' and all sections of seating will fill from the front to the back, that is from those closest to the altar to those furthest from the altar. It is important to enter a pew in any section from the center aisle only. This is to prevent folks from having to climb over you to get to an unused spot in the middle of a pew.

**WHEN MASS STARTS**

Other than within immediate families seated together, there is to be no physical contact among Mass attendees. You will find that all hymnals & missals have been removed from the pews. An option if you have a smart phone is to pull up the Mass parts and readings on your phone using the [Laudate](#) app, which can be uploaded free on your phone's 'app store.'

**PROCESSIONS & OFFERTORY**

At the beginning and end of Mass, the priest celebrant will process in and out alone. Collection baskets will not be passed and there will be no offertory processions. A collection basket will be on a stand inside the doors of the church at all 10 of our regularly scheduled weekly Masses. Please place your gift in a basket upon entering or leaving the church at the weekly Mass you attend. Otherwise, we encourage all to utilize our opportunities for automatic scheduled bank draft (ACH) or electronic funds transfer (EFT) giving. **AT COMMUNION TIME**

It will be important that all in attendance file out of the pew in order, maintaining at least 6 feet between each other, when approaching for Holy Communion, even if you only cross your arms across your chest to receive a blessing instead of Holy Communion. When you enter the center aisle from either section of pews, you'll be merging into a single-file Communion line. For when the communion line 'stalls,' you will see distancing lines 'taped' on the floor in the main aisles at 6 ft intervals. For the protection of both communicant and minister of Holy Communion, all are urged to receive Holy Communion only in the hands. When you receive it in your hands, step aside, lower or raise your face mask for only as long as it take you to place Communion inside your mouth, and file by way of the side aisles to your seat in the pews. Only approach the Communion minister after the person in front of you has stepped aside after receiving Communion.

**EXIT THE CHURCH ONLY IN THE REVERSE ORDER OF ENTRY**

Just as the pews filled from front to back from the center aisles upon arriving at church, it's important that they empty to the center aisles from the back to the front at the end of Mass. Please make no 'mad dash' down a side aisle creating a 'back up' at the exit doors. If seated in the main nave (center body) of the church', please exit through the rear (main) doors of the church.

**PROCEED DIRECTLY TO YOUR VEHICLES IN THE PARKING LOT**

Everyone should continue wearing face coverings when exiting the church and until getting safely to your vehicle. Please do not stop to socialize on the way out or on the sidewalks or in the parking lot.
